## **Learning Spaces**

Learning Environments is working with the Registrar's Office to identify "teaching studios" on campus that faculty can use to record a lecture or teach from. If the faculty member doesn't want to teach remotely from home or his/her office, s/he can request a room (teaching studio) from which to teach or record a lecture. If faculty wish to reserve one of these spaces, s/he should email <a href="registrar@rice.edu">registrar@rice.edu</a> with the request.

Coming soon the schools will be able to request the face shields from FEP should they wish to use one while teaching.

Work has begun on the <a href="phase I and II rooms">phase I and II rooms</a>. Included in this phase are the <a href="specialized spaces">spaces</a> in the School of Architecture and the Shepherd School of Music. Most of the rooms in this phase will be partially complete by early August with completion scheduled for mid-August due to items waiting to arrive. As soon as rooms become available for testing, this will be communicated to faculty so they can come to campus to test.

### Labs and Other Complex Spaces

Learning Environments worked with the School of Natural Sciences, the School of Engineering and the School of Humanities to identify specialized spaces critical for program needs. The needs in the spaces were determined in collaboration with the faculty teaching in those spaces. These <a href="mailto:spaces">spaces</a> will be in the next phase with completion targeted for the start of school.

#### Software

LE is changing the license terms on a few of their software packages that will allow for students to download it to their own computer. Running the software off their own computer is always the best. However, on campus computers will be available to students on campus and for those studying remotely, a pool of software will be available to use. ## Training

Training for updated classrooms will be coming in early August. Learning Environments is collaborating with the Digital Media Commons in the library to produce documentation, videos and offer one-on-one sessions.
